Builder Reports: Don Key has installed the flap and flap controls on his Mustang II. He explained that it is one piece and crosses the fuselage, unlike most aircraft which have one flap panel per wing. He is now trying to decide whether he wants to install an aluminum or fiberglass fuel tank. Spencer Gould displayed a sample of the carbon fiber wing spar material he has been experimenting with. It seems the instructions given to him by the salesperson did not quite work out. He likes the material but cautioned builders to beware of such information, especially stress numbers. Newcomer Ernie Santana described his Barracuda project as the airframe is basically complete and the engine has been hung. He is currently looking for a hangar.

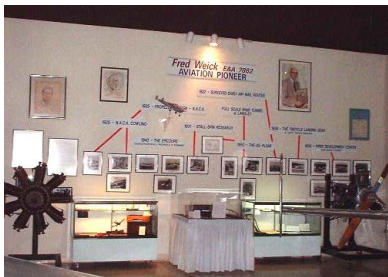
