KVRB AIRPORT NEWS

After a short delay, the Runway 11L-29R Rehab project is now under way. Currently, Runway 11L-29R, Taxiway F and a portion of Taxiway D are closed, and will not re-open until completion of the project, which is expected in mid-October.

At some point during the project, it will be necessary to close Runway 4-22 as well, for a period of 7 days. The exact date of this additional closure is yet to be determined. JULY 2010 MEETING MINUTES:

Minutes of the General Membership Meeting July 13, 2010, by Alex W.

President Mike D. opened the meeting at 7:06 PM. There were 13 members and 1 guest present.

PRESIDENT: Mike D. reported that he had received a letter from EAA headquarters notifying the chapter that Sylvia P. has received the 2010 Web Editor Award which will be presented at EAA AirVenture on July 31st. Ken M. will be asked to accept the award since he is planning to be there all week. Mike D. also updated everyone on Gerd and Sylvia's trip to Germany and back in their Cessna 340. Sylvia sent greetings to the chapter members via a postcard from Germany (see page 3). They plan to depart in early August for the return trip to Vero Beach.

SECRETARY: Alex W. reported to the membership that the minutes of the June meeting were posted on the bulletin board and may be read online at the Chapter 99 website.

TREASURER: Mike D. reported that our Treasure, John M. was out of town and reported on his behalf that our current balance was unchanged from last month.

VICE PRESIDENT: Keith G. reported that representatives from Angel Flight attended the planning meeting and asked that Chapter 99 assist them in restoring the fuselage exterior from a Piper Seneca so that it could be placed on a trailer and be used as a float, in parades around South Florida, to bring awareness to Angel Flight and their mission. Keith G. reported that it looked like the biggest item needed might be a right hand windshield and that he was working with Angel flight to try to locate one. A new one has been located that would cost \$158 but he was still looking to see if a used one could be found. He reported that the project would require some fiberglass work, as well as some metal work and asked that members interested in working on the project contact him. It was pointed out that the work only will be to make the plane look good cosmetically. Chapter 99 and other contributors to the project would be invited to place their logos on the finished project to show their support for Angel Flight. John H. indicated that he thought he might have a used windshield that might work. Keith said that there had been some discussion of using the Cherokee Six that Sue D. has but it turns out that the school board now owns it and that it would not be available. Keith G. reported that if a used windshield is available then he thought that the biggest expense would be the fiber glassing and asked for volunteers to assist on the project.

Keith G. also reported that Bob F. has offered the Chapter some rudder controls and joystick for our flight simulator. He recommended that we accept the equipment and forwarded the information to Alex W. for follow-up.

Keith G. also reported that the Vero Beach City Council has announced that special-call City Council meeting has been scheduled on August 18 to hear complaints from a group of citizens that the airport protest group. He said that he would like to see as many of our members as possible attend the meeting in our Chapter 99 shirts to show support for the airport, and that an email would be sent out advising every one of the date and time. The protest group is now complaining that the aircraft operating out of the airport represent an environmental safety issue and are asking that a study be made. Keith pointed out that such a study would probably cost the city a million dollars.

Mike D. pointed out that a similar study at one of the cities on Florida's West Coast wound up costing three million after interested third parties sued the city in protest of the tests. Keith G. thought we should get involved and if the opportunity was given for input from the floor that members should voice our support of the airport operations and in opposition to the spending tax dollars on a study instead of on our schools, teachers, firefighters and police. He will also contact AOPA to see about getting them involved in the issue.

WEBMASTER: Sylvia P. was not able to attend the meeting since she and Gerd are in Germany.

BUILDERS: John H. brought in the engine mount that he has fabricated for his Kitfox and showed it to the membership.

Doug E. reported that he has glued up the third wing rib for the Pitts S-1 that he is building. He also has completed his aileron ribs. So far his construction has taken place in his living room like a true amateur builder.


<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> There was no other old business.
